SAILING NORTHBOUND ABOARD CELEBRITY SUMMIT WITH TWO-NIGHT LAND JOURNEY IN ANCHORAGE



Join The Museum of Russian Art on an Alaskan Cruise adventure! Explore areas that were influenced by the Russian colonization of Alaska that lasted less than a century, but in that time produced a rich history of enduring importance. Although the original impetus for colonizing Alaska was the fur trade, the Russian Orthodox Church had probably the greatest lasting impact on the people of Alaska, helping to create a multicultural Orthodox community that exists to this day. In Sitka, one of the last few Alaskan cities with Russian Heritage still visible, we will explore St. Michael's Russian Orthodox Cathedral, the Russian Bishop's House, the Sitka Historical Museum, Baranof Castle State Historic Site, and the Sitka National Historical Park. Another special inclusion is a visit to the Eklutna Historical Park which is one of the area's oldest continuously inhabited Athabaskan settlements. Russian Orthodox missionaries came here in the early 1800s, and you can still see St. Nicholas Church, the oldest standing building in greater Anchorage. This adventure combines Russian and Alaskan history, while experiencing some of the most spectacular, awe-inspiring scenery and landscapes of the United States.

DAY 1 | THURSDAY, AUGUST 14

DEPART HOME | VANCOUVER, CANADA Depart your home city for Vancouver. Upon your arrival, transfer from the Vancouver Airport to your hotel for check-in at the Pan Pacific Hotel. Among the world's most livable cities - diverse. cultural, beautiful - this culinary capital treats you to fresh local seafood, farm-to-table produce, and authentic Asian flavors. West Coast architecture modernism with a woodsy bent - emerged here. But while downtown shines with steel and glass, its epicenter is green Stanley Park, a 1,000-acre oasis of spectacular beaches, trails, and views. North of town, ride scenic Sea to Sky Highway along the coast and through the forest toward Whistler, 2,200 feet above sea level. On your way, behold lofty Shannon Falls and brave the heartpounding Sky Pilot Suspension Bridge. Enjoy a free afternoon in Vancouver, followed by a welcome dinner. (D)

DAY 2 | FRIDAY, AUGUST 15 VANCOUVER, CANADA EMBARK - DEPART 5:00 PM

After breakfast at the hotel, enjoy a free morning before walking to the nearby pier. This afternoon you depart on your Alaskan Cruise. (B, D)

DAY 3 | SATURDAY, AUGUST 16

CRUISING THE INSIDE PASSAGE, ALASKA DAY AT SEA

You'll sail beyond the Inside Passage into the more protected Alaska Inside Passage in southeastern Alaska. This complex labyrinth of fjords, bays, and lush green islands is home to an abundance of wildlife, including orca, mountain goats, bald eagles, bears, puffins, sea otters and much more. During the summer months, the long hours of daylight allow for ample opportunities for nature photos on your Inside Passage Cruise. You'll never forget the sight of 40-ton whales hurling themselves into the air, almost completely escaping the water. If you're especially lucky, you could see them swimming together to create a bubble net, trapping and eating fish by the giant mouthful. (B, L, D)



DAY 4 | SUNDAY, AUGUST 17 KETCHIKAN, ALASKA ARRIVE 7:00 AM - DEPART 3:00 PM

You've never tasted salmon so fresh. Known as the 'Salmon Capital of the World', Ketchikan is also the ancestral home of the Tlingit people, who have carved the world's largest collection of totem poles. If you're up for an adventure, take a canoe and nature trail excursion through the rain forest or a wilderness exploration followed by a sumptuous crab feast you'll long remember. (B, L, D)

DAY 5 | MONDAY, AUGUST 18

SITKA, ALASKA ARRIVE 7:00 AM - DEPART 3:30 PM

A Russian settlement until the Alaska Purchase of 1867, Sitka's Russian heritage is still very much rooted in the city. Visit St. Michael's Russian Orthodox Cathedral for a pristine example of period architecture. Nestled on the coast of the Gulf of Alaska, there's much natural beauty to explore on a Sitka cruise. A walk along the promenade in Whale Park offers a chance to view breaching humpback whales while a trek into Sitka Historical Park reveals stunning coastal trails and hundred-year-old totem poles. Venture to Tongass National Forest for up close views of wildlife, including Alaska Coastal Brown Bears, American Bald Eagles and Sitka Blacktail Deer. Or head to the Sheldon Jackson Museum, the oldest standing structure in all of Alaska which is home to a small, yet impressive collection of artifacts from all of Alaska's indigenous groups.

SPECIAL INCLUSION A private TMORA Shore Excursion is included today with visits to St. Michael's Russian Orthodox Cathedral, the Russian Bishop's House, Sitka Historical Museum, Baranof Castle State Historic Site, and the Sitka National Historical Park. (B, L, D)

DAY 6 | TUESDAY, AUGUST 19 JUNEAU, ALASKA

ARRIVE 7:00 AM - DEPART 9:30 PM

Here's your chance to take a glacial dogsled adventure in Alaska's capital, where cultured sophistication meets the ruggedness of the Last Frontier.



With its snowcapped mountains, misty rainforests, massive glaciers and bounty of wildlife, Alaska's remote state capital is the perfect place to dive into nature. Framed by Mount Juneau and Mount Roberts, the city's picturesque downtown area offers centuries-old bars, boutique shops and historic landmarks. For a taste of the local culture, visit the historic district and the Alaska State Museum. And for outdoor thrills, you can take your pick of activities ranging from whale watching in Auke Bay Harbor to tundra trekking over Mendenhall Glacier, and even try your hand at gold panning in Last Chance Basin. (B, L, D)

DAY 7 | WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 20 ICY STRAIT POINT, ALASKA

ARRIVE 7:00 AM - DEPART 5:00 PM

For thousands of years, the Tlingit have called this place home. Located near the city of Hoonah, and home to a historic cannery, Icy Strait Point also offers travelers the chance to view wildlife like humpback whales, orcas, seals, eagles, and brown bears, or to explore monuments to the region's fishing heritage. (B, L, D)

DAY 8 | THURSDAY, AUGUST 21 CRUISING HUBBARD GLACIER, ALASKA DAY AT SEA

The Hubbard Glacier is located about 30 miles north off the coast of Yakutat and is by far one of Alaska's most exciting natural treasures. On your cruise to Hubbard Glacier, enjoy incredible picture-perfect views of this glorious mount of ice from about every angle on your ship. Named after Gardiner Hubbard, the founder and president of the National Geographic Society, Hubbard Glacier is the longest tidewater glacier in the world. Dramatically massive at about 7-miles wide, 76-miles long and as tall as a 30-story building above the waterline, it's the largest river of ice in North America. While most of the world's glaciers are retreating, the Hubbard Glacier has continued to thicken over the years and on rare occasion will partially block Russell Fjord, temporarily damming its passage. Cruise Hubbard Glacier and experience the wilds of Alaska as your ship makes its way through icy waters turning from Yakutat Bay into the narrow Disenchantment Bay to come face-to-face with the towering Hubbard Glacier.



The strong currents and riptides that flow between Gilbert Point and the face of the glacier cause calving to occur on daily basis, sending massive chunks of ice crashing into Disenchantment Bay. Witness this awe-inspiring phenomenon onboard a Hubbard Glacier cruise through the misty, chilled air of the Gulf of Alaska. The dedicated onboard naturalist narrates the experience and keeps an eye out for the whales, harbor seals, and otters that hunt and play in the waters of Yakutat Bay. It's an adventure of a lifetime. (B, L, D)

DAY 9 | FRIDAY, AUGUST 22

SEWARD, ALASKA | ANCHORAGE, ALASKA ARRIVE 6:00 AM - DISEMBARK

Edging the Kenai Peninsula and framed by the glacier-covered Kenai Mountains that run along its southeastern spine, Seward is a rustic port town whose grand terrain will leave you breathless. The pristine wilderness is home to nesting seabirds, countless islands, wetlands, and breathtaking views. And, as the gateway to the Kenai Fjords National Park, the Harding Icefield — an expanse of ice and snow created over 23,000 years ago — is easily within reach and culminates in 40 glaciers that dramatically calve into the sea. The throngs of wildlife that course below, and glide above the glacial waters, are legion. Pods of humpback whales are known to breach when hunting, seals and sea lions lounge on rocky outcroppings and bald eagles hover overhead.

After disembarking from your cruise ship, meet your guide for your continuing land adventure. Travel to Anchorage with a stop along the way at the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center. Upon arrival in Anchorage, check into your hotel. The remainder of your day is free to explore downtown Anchorage. (B, L)

DAY 10 | SATURDAY, AUGUST 23

ANCHORAGE, ALASKA

After breakfast at the hotel, depart for the Alaska Native Heritage Center. The Alaska Native Heritage Center (ANHC) is a living cultural center located in Anchorage, Alaska, that promotes active observance of Alaska Native culture and traditions. Tour a native village and experience a Native dance performance. From here you will continue to Eklutna Historical Park.



Dating back to 1650, the park is the area's oldest continuously inhabited Athabaskan settlement. Russian Orthodox missionaries came here in the early 1800s, and you can still see St. Nicholas Church, the oldest standing building in greater Anchorage. View the colorful Spirit Houses built over the graves of the deceased, along with an Orthodox Christian Cross -- a custom that came from the melding of the cultures. Continue with a visit to the Anchorage Museum which sits on the traditional homeland of the Eklutna Dena'ina. The museum is committed to recognizing and honoring the land, culture and language of the Dena'ina people. They recognize and respect the continuing connection, by Alaska Native people and all Indigenous people, to the land, waters and communities. End your day in Anchorage at your hotel. Dinner is included tonight. (B, L, D)

DAY 11 | SUNDAY, AUGUST 24

ANCHORAGE, ALASKA | RETURN HOME Enjoy some free time to explore downtown Anchorage after breakfast at the hotel. Later depart for the Anchorage Airport for your return flight home. (B)
