# THE MUSEUM OF RUSSIAN ART 2023 ANNUAL REPORT



### 2023: YEAR IN REVIEW A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

For The Museum of Russian Art (TMORA), 2023 was an exciting year of growth and transition.

As noted in last year's report, we purchased the Overland Gallery building in December to provide much needed storage space for our growing collection, along with gallery space for education programs and special events. The renovation design process began early in the year for the purposes of separating the Museum's space from that of its tenant, the Overland Gallery, and to make the Museum's space handicap accessible. This work also included a new roof for the building and, by the end of the year, all that was left to be done was the completion of the renovation of the restrooms. The expectation is that the building will begin to host programs in the fall of 2024.

A significant organizational financial goal was achieved in 2023, with the establishment of the Museum's endowment, which was initiated by a \$500,000 gift from the Robert J. Brokop Trust. Endowment was a missing piece in the Museum's plan for financial sustainability and, now that it is in place, its growth will help secure TMORA's future.

TMORA's goal to achieve accreditation from the American Alliance of Museums (AAM) moved forward in 2023 when the AAM approved our application to enter into the accreditation process. This entailed submitting a detailed self-study of our operations in September, to be followed by a site visit by an accreditation team in the spring of 2024. The decision from the AAM Accreditation Committee, which will review all of the Museum's application materials, could come as early as July of 2024.

As is the case with most art museums, attendance at TMORA is still recovering from the effects of the pandemic, as the year ended with visitation at 78% of that of 2019, the last pre-pandemic year. However, December attendance of 3,662 slightly exceeded that of December 2019 and was the first month since that time to go over 3,000. Ideally, this trend will continue in 2024 and bring us closer to our pre-pandemic norm.

December's outstanding attendance can be attributed to the excellent exhibitions on view and the programs that took place during the month. *The Art of Leon Hushcha: The Way*, an exhibition of works by this prominent Minneapolis-based Ukrainian-American artist, opened and included Hushcha's first anti-war artwork. This continued in the vein of the Museum's 2023 exhibitions reflecting the war in Ukraine, which included Ukrainian-American Elena Kalman's *Ukraine Defiant* show and the ongoing *Say No to War* exhibition of cartoons by Ukrainian and Russian artists. National attention came to the Museum in October, when a full-page article appeared in the *New York Times*, chronicling how the Museum has reacted to the war in Ukraine with these anti-war exhibitions.


The month also saw the completion of the series of six concerts commemorating the 150th anniversary of the birth of Sergei Rachmaninoff. These concerts of Rachmaninoff's works, which included the complete presentation of his pieces for two pianos, were the classical music highlights of the year. On the contemporary side of the music spectrum, the March Vysotsky+Dylan concert, sponsored by the Forum for Cultural Exchange, featured eight singer/musicians from Russia, New York, and the Twin Cities, backed by a 13-piece orchestra. It was an exuberant cross-cultural event, and a film of the performance is expected to appear in 2024.

Once again, my thanks go out to the staff, Trustees, volunteers, and members who make all of TMORA's service to the community possible.


